Examination of Conscience Based on the Beatitudes

Blessed are the poor in spirit.

Am I humble enough to acknowledge my total dependence on God? Am I able to admit that I don't have all the answers? Can I admit mistakes without blaming others?

Blessed are those who mourn.

Do I stop to examine my losses, or do I miss the opportunity to be closer to God? Do I figure out why I fail to do good? Do I take my broken promises to God? Do I turn to God when facing death or loss of a loved one? Do I console and help those who mourn and suffer? Have I been able to say: "I am sorry" and really mean it?

Blessed are the humble.

Blessed are the pure of heart.



On 8 February 2023, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops issued four pastoral letters on reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples. Intended as a framework for local engagement with Indigenous Peoples, the letters are the fruit of many months of listening, encounter, and dialogue with them, including through Listening Circles, the Indigenous Delegation to the Vatican

in April 2022, and Pope Francis' Apostolic Voyage to Canada in July of the same year.
